



Name and Gender Marker - Updating ID

After a judge has signed the order that legally changes your name and gender marker, there are two things you need to do to update your IDs:

1: Get copies of your order

To use the court order to update your IDs, you need to get it certified. A certified order has a special stamp that tells people it is an official court document.

To get certified copies of your order, go to the clerk's office. This is the same office where you started your case.

It can cost up to \$2 a page to get the order certified. You should get 3-5 orders.

2: Update your IDs

Updating IDs requires a lot of paperwork and running around. Each place that gives you an ID has its own rules about how to update the name and gender marker.
