

## How Do I Apply?

Apply at the Indiana Department of Workforce Development's website: [dwd.in.gov](http://dwd.in.gov). You will need a form of identification and information about your wages and employment in order to apply

## Informational Tips

- File your weekly vouchers by 9:00 pm (Eastern Time) every Saturday
- If you need assistance filing your claim you should call 1-800-891-6499
- Check your Uplink account regularly and monitor all DWD correspondence
- Adverse decisions are called Determinations
- Appeal any Determination within 10 days of receiving it
- DWD cannot take any steps towards collection until all appeals have been exhausted
- Read DWD's "Claimant Handbook"

# Unemployment Benefit Programs

Program	State Unemployment Insurance (UI)	Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)	Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)	Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC)
<b>Benefits</b>	Weekly monetary benefits up to 26 weeks.	\$149-\$390 weekly monetary benefit available for a maximum of 75 weeks. 39 weeks available from 1/27/2020 to 12/26/2020 and 36 weeks available from 12/27/2020 to 9/4/2021.	Additional \$300 per week from 12/27/2020 to 9/04/2021. Previously was an additional \$600 per week from 3/29/2020 to 07/25/2020	Additional 49 weeks of the equivalent of state UI benefits.
<b>Eligibility</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be unemployed through no fault of your own.</li> <li>• Earned sufficient wages during base period.</li> <li>• Be able, available, and actively seeking full-time work.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must be ineligible for state unemployment insurance.</li> <li>• Must be unemployed, partially unemployed, or unable or unavailable to work because of certain health or economic consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must have been receiving any other benefits including state UI, PUA or PEUC during 3/14/2021 through 9/04/2021. Previously from 12/27/2020 to 3/14/2021.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Exhausted 26 weeks of state unemployment insurance (UI).</li> <li>• Eligible for State UI had you not exhausted benefits (although states must offer flexibility on “actively seeking work” where there are COVID-19 impacts and constraints).</li> </ul>



This brochure describes the programs applicable to most claimants, however other programs such as the Mixed Earners Unemployment Compensation, and Lost Wage Assistance may be available once you submit your application.
