

## How Do I Apply?

---

You can apply at the Indiana Department of Workforce Development's website: [www.dwd.in.gov](http://www.dwd.in.gov). You will need a form of identification and information about your wages and employment in order to apply.

## Informational Tips

---

- File your weekly vouchers by 9:00 pm (Eastern Time) every Saturday
- If you need assistance filing your claim you should call 1-800-891-6499
- Check your Uplink account regularly and monitor all DWD correspondence
- Adverse decisions are called Determinations
- Appeal any Determination within 10 days of receiving it
- DWD cannot take any steps towards collection until after the overpayment determination becomes final
- Read information for claimants on the DWD website
- Translation services and general assistance is available by calling 1-800-891-6499

# Unemployment Benefit Programs

**\*Figures specific to Indiana\***

Program	State Unemployment Insurance (UI)	Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)	Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)	Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC)
<b>Benefits</b>	Weekly monetary benefits up to 26 weeks for that benefit year. (39 weeks due to PEUC)	\$149 - \$390 weekly monetary benefit up to 39 weeks for weeks of unemployment beginning on or after January 27, 2020 up to December 26, 2020	Additional \$600 per week from March 29, 2020 – July 31, 2020	Additional 13 weeks of the equivalent of state UI benefits
<b>Eligibility</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be unemployed through no fault of their own.</li> <li>• Earned sufficient wages during an individual's base period</li> <li>• Be able, available, and actively seeking full-time work.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must be ineligible for state unemployment benefits</li> <li>• Must be unemployed, partially unemployed, or unable or unavailable to work because of certain health or economic consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Must have been receiving any other benefits including, state UI, PUA, or PEUC, during March 29 through July 31.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Exhausted all State and Federal law benefits</li> <li>• Eligible for State UI had you not exhausted benefits (although states must offer flexibility on "actively seeking work" where there are COVID-19 impacts and constraints)</li> </ul>

## Do I need to know which programs I am eligible for?

You do not need to know which program you may be eligible for. Start an application for all programs at [www.in.gov/dwd/unemployment](http://www.in.gov/dwd/unemployment).

## Are these all of the UI programs?

Yes, however, further unemployment programs may be added in 2021, so you are encouraged to apply if you may be eligible.
