

# February 2024 Alert: Gender Affirming Medical Care for MINORS

## Earlier this week a Federal Court allowed Indiana's law that bans medical providers from providing gender-affirming health care to transgender youth to go into effect.

This guide explains what this ban means for you and your child.

#### Your child can still get gender-affirming mental health care.

The law only bans doctors and other medical providers from providing certain medical care to minors. It does not ban a doctor, social worker, or therapist from providing gender-affirming mental health care.

The law bans the following:

- Puberty blockers
- Hormone replacement therapy
- All gender affirming surgery, such as top surgery, bottom surgery, or facial feminization

#### You can help your child get gender-affirming medical care in another state.

The law does not limit your right to find gender-affirming care for your child in another state.

### Your child's doctor may not be able to help you find a doctor in another state.

The law prohibits physicians from referring a minor patient to another physician in or outside of Indiana for this type of care. You should contact your child's doctor about what kind of support is available.
